Course Description	This qualification reflects the role of workers in the community who follow an individualised plan to provide personal-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing. Work involves using discretion and judgement in relation to individual support as well as taking responsibility for own outputs. Workers have a range of factual, technical and procedural knowledge, as well as some theoretical knowledge of the concepts and practices required to provide person-centred support. To achieve this qualification, students must have completed at least 120 hours of work placement.		
Pathways	Completion of the full Certificate III leads to pathways into Aged Care Work, Community Work, Disability Work, Enrolled and Registered Nursing.
